The Village Consultative Body is a community consultative institution in the village, a working partner of the village head in administration, development, and society, which functions as a legislative, supervisory body. It accommodates and channels the aspirations of the community. The research method is exploratory research, namely by focusing on specific objects exploring something related to general statements—the number of samples as many as 18 people or sample Saturated (Total Sample). The results of this study are 1) Village Autonomy is essentially carried out jointly between the government community. Still, the ability of the village government as a development initiator, communicator, and manager (leader) in the implementation of development has been running optimally. 2) Community participation in implementing village autonomy This has been going well; this is indicated by the opportunity to participate in development activities and the emergence of awareness and willingness to participate.

2. Literature Review

Village Representative Body (BPD)

The legal basis for establishing the Village Representative Body (BPD) can be seen in Article 94 of Law Number 32 of 2004 concerning Regional Government. This provision expressly states that a Village Government and Village Representative Body are formed in the village, which is the Village Government. Furthermore, in the explanation of the article, it is stated that the term Village Representative Body can be adapted to the socio-cultural conditions of the local community. The village community carries out the formation of the Village Government and the Village Representative Body (Ahdan et al., 2019; Tamsah et al., 2020). Thus, the term or designation for BPD may differ from one village to another. This depends on or is following the aspirations and needs and the socio-cultural conditions of the local community (Gani et al., 2019; Mustafa et al., 2020; Sahabuddin et al., 2019).

The Village Representative Body as a representative body is a vehicle for implementing democracy based on Pancasila. BPD has not been formed, then based on Article 7 of the Decree of the Minister of Home Affairs Number 63 of 1999 concerning Implementation Guidelines and Adjustment of Terminology in the Implementation of Village and Sub-District Government. The Village Consultative Body (LMD) continues to carry out its duties until the establishment of the BPD.

In-Law Number 32 of 2004 concerning Regional Government, which also regulates villages, it is emphasized that the village as a legal community unit has the authority to control. And manage the local community's interests based on local origins and customs, which are recognized in the national government system and are in the district, with the knowledge that the village has the authority to control and manage the interests of its assembly according to local conditions and socio-cultural conditions (Dana et al., 2021; Darno et al., 2021; Fatmawati, Tamsah, Romadhoni, et al., 2021; Fitriani et al., 2021; Herlinah et al., 2021; Kasmiaty et al., 2021; Mislia et al., 2021; Nasriani et al., 2021; Rahmat et al., 2021). With this understanding, it is apparent that this law provides the basis for a selfgoverning community, which is a community that regulates itself (Hasbi et al., 2019; Yusriadi, Farida, et al., 2019; Zamad et al., 2021). The position with genuine autonomy is very strategic. It requires balanced attention to the implementation of regional autonomy because substantial village autonomy will significantly affect the realization of regional autonomy (Misnawati et al., 2021; Nellyanti, Gunawan, Azis, et al., 2021).

Providing an understanding of Village Autonomy does take time; a process of experience is needed to apply it correctly. Likewise, with the implementation of the Village Government administration system, especially for the Village Head and Village Apparatus and members of the Village Representative Body who have just been inaugurated. To apply it takes a long time to understand it first considering that there are fundamental changes in Village Government arrangements, of course, it will take a long time. have a direct impact on changing the village administration system (Asfar et al., 2021; Harisman et al., 2021; Heranto et al., 2021; Mardhiah et al., 2021; Nikmawati et al., 2021; Rahmitasari et al., 2021; Rasyid et al., 2021; Rusli et al., 2021; Suryanti et al., 2021). Therefore, to provide a complete understanding, we will discuss the village administration system in this paper.

Refers to various administrative meanings in general, which reads that administration is a process of activities carried out by one or more people to achieve goals (Ms et al., 2021; Setiawan et al., 2021). 3. Method

Population and Sample

To complete development in the Ulaweng Cinnong Village Area, Bone Regency and can run smoothly with optimal support from non-governmental organizations, several suggestions are proposed that might help the Village Head and his apparatus in increasing development in his area as stated as follows: 1) For autonomy Villages can run smoothly and are carried out based on the principle of self-help, it is recommended to continue to make efforts that can increase public awareness, of their role in development, so that self-help coordination to finance development can run smoothly. 2) In village autonomy, community self-help plays an important role; therefore, the government is obliged to foster and develop community self-help mutual assistance so that development efforts can continue and do not experience obstacles.
